Note that when an individual is logged into the system, only those programs which are age-appropriate for the logged-in person's account will be shown. If you cannot find the program for which you wish to enroll, please ensure that you are logged into the account of the person you wish to register. FIND YOUR PATH

A new trail is coming to North Port! On Sept. 2, the City held a ceremonial groundbreaking for the **Myakkahatchee Creek Greenway Nature Trail!** This one-mile passive walking trail is the first phase of the Myakkahatchee Creek Greenway Master Plan that was approved in 2007. The accessible trail has been engineered to avoid wetland impacts wherever possible, minimize overlap with the existing primitive bike trail, mitigate the impact to existing vegetation and native trees, and preserve and enhance the natural scenic features along the greenway. 



OUR COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE IN SERVICE



The National Recreation and Park Association's (NRPA) Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA) provides a standard of excellence for park and recreation agencies throughout the United States by providing agencies with a management system of best practices. CAPRA is the only national accreditation of park and recreation agencies

available and is a valuable measure of an agency's overall quality of operation, management and service to the community. Achieving CAPRA accreditation is the gold standard to demonstrate that your agency and your staff provide your community with the highest level of service.

In 2019, the City of North Port Parks & Recreation Department achieved CAPRA accreditation embodying its vision to be a recognized leader in providing parks, facilities and programs that increase wellness and enrich life experiences within our community. CAPRA accreditation assures policymakers, department staff and the general public that an accredited park and recreation agency has the operational capacity to deliver programs, facilities and services at a high level of quality. Standards for national accreditation are evaluated through a process of peer verification of compliance with the 154 standards. Meeting all of these standards requires an on-going collaboration between City of North Port Parks & Recreation and other City departments, community partners, and our most important stakeholder, the citizen! Currently, there are only 197 accredited park and recreation agencies in the United States, with 26 of those here in the state of Florida.

The City of North Port Parks & Recreation strives for this level of excellence for many reasons. Parks strengthen community ties, bring diverse populations together and are at the center of so many experiences and memories. Our programs, facilities and amenities not only support the health and well-being of families and youth, but also contribute to the economic and environmental prosperity of the City of North Port. The department grossed over \$3.5 million in revenue for the 2022 Fiscal Year (October 2021-September 2022), which included over 7,500 reservations and rentals of park amenities including pavilions, meeting rooms, athletic fields, camp sites and more!

CAPRA accreditation reflects a commitment to excellence by the City of North Port Parks & Recreation Department. It is our on-going commitment to support quality of life through healthy and socially rewarding activities, economic prosperity and building a community of unity.







WARM MINERAL SPRINGS PARK



Owned by the City of North Port, Warm **Mineral Springs Park** is a valuable ecological and historically significant site that dates back 11,000 years. The springs

and building structures are listed in the US National Register of Historic Places, on Sarasota County's Significant Resource List and recognized locally on the City of North Port Local Register of Historical Sites and Structures.

In 2019, the City adopted the Warm Mineral Springs Park Master Plan which included a comprehensive analysis of the entire 81.6 acre property and recommendations for future services and amenities. Since that time, the City has been working to solidify and finance a plan to restore the existing structures and implement improvements to utility infrastructure and parking.





In September of 2022, the City received two unsolicited publicprivate partnership (P3) conceptual proposals related to the Warm Mineral Springs Park Master Plan Building Restoration & Improvements and Future Phases. The proposals outlined substantial investment and support for completion of the planned restoration and improvements along with future amenities. The City is currently working with Warm Mineral Springs Development Group, LLC to pursue a possible P3 relationship for development of this site.

In September of 2022, the City experienced unexpected setbacks to both the operation and future restoration of the park from

Hurricane lan. The storm caused significant damage and it was determined the park could not safely reopen without substantial repairs. As a result, the park has been temporarily closed. The City is currently evaluating options for safe reopening while still pursuing the potential P3 opportunity.

MARINA PARK

Marina Park, located off Chancellor Boulevard, offers an opportunity to access the lower portion of the Myakkahatchee Creek. From there, you can travel southwest to the Myakka River—the only one of Florida's rivers to receive the designation of "Wild and Scenic River" —a title reserved for rivers of spectacular beauty with an undeveloped nature. A day on these waters is sure to rejuvenate the spirit. (Fun fact: The Myakka was also the filming spot of some of the early Tarzan movies!)

Marina Park is open to motorized boaters and offers a canoe/kayak launch. The waterways are ideal for fishing, watching manatees, catching glimpses of dolphins, and so much more. Learn more about Marina Park at NorthPortFL.gov/MyLocalParks.







MYAKKAHATCHEE CREEK ENVIRONMENTAL PARK (MCEP)

The Myakkahatchee Creek Environmental Park offers a peaceful opportunity to explore natural Florida. Enjoy a scenic overlook of the creek, then hike down winding wooded trails that weave throughout a moss-draped oak canopy, where you'll find vibrant native flowers and trees. Deeper in the park you'll find wild, natural orange trees that decorate the edges of the park's trails.
